Fall Yard Waste Collection 2017

Weeks of October 23 & 30 and Weeks of November 6, 13, 20 & 27

Curbside yard waste will be picked up on your regular trash day. Please have curbside prior to 7AM. Place leaves, grass clippings & twigs, (less than 1") into brown paper leaf bags, or open barrels, no lids please. Plastic bags will be rejected curbside, but can be emptied out at 225 Plain St. (Drop-Off Compost Site). Branches & shrubs can also be brought to Plain Street. Open April – January, Wednesday through Sunday--7:15 AM-2:45 PM.

Trash sticker required - may be obtained at the Collector's Office at Town Hall (781-794-8130).
