

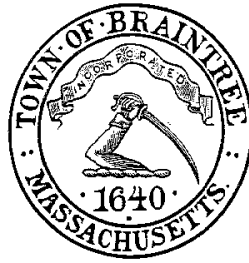

COMMUNICATIONS AND REPORTS FROM THE MAYOR AND TOWN BOARDS

- 126 16 Council President: Introduction of Chief Shastany and Mayor's Update to the Council
Mayor Sullivan stated we are working through a difficult situation. The evidence investigation continues. Town Solicitor, Lisa Maki is in touch with the Attorney General's office and this is ongoing. Dan Linsky is helping with the evidence room and training of the officers and this is ongoing.
October 7, 2016 Chief Shastany joined us. The Chief has integrity and a lot of experience in this area of evidence. Mayor Sullivan stated this is a painful period of time. We are taking corrective steps so this does not happen in the future.

Chief Shastany stated it is an honor and privilege to be here to serve you. I am guided by high integrity standards. I was driven to come and help. I believe in meeting with the officers and asking for their input. Braintree will be looked at for their state of the art accountability and how to handle evidence in the future.

OLD BUSINESS

- 16 060 National Grid Petition: MBTA Track Heater Elm Street and Old Elm Street or take up any action relative thereto

Council President Powers referred to DPW Committee Chair Councilor Mullaney on recommendations.

Councilor Mullaney stated this is recommended for favorable action to the full council.

Councilor Ryan read the following MOTION:

To install and maintain approximately 60 feet more or less of 2 inch gas main in Old Elm Street, from the existing 6 inch gas main at building # 131-145 southerly to 129A Elm Street, the MBTA Track Heater with the following conditions:

BELD: BELD Engineering has reviewed this permit and has no underground electric utility conflicts within the proposed scope of work.

DPW: This section of Elm Street and Service Road is not under the moratorium. The street has not been resurfaced in several years. We recommend that the petition for this section be granted under the normal conditions, with emphasis on the requirements that the gas main be laid outside of the trench of the water mains in service and that the trench pavement not be left low for any length of time; We also recommend that the following requirement be added to the permit, if it is to be granted:

"Neither National Grid nor any of its contractors is authorized to close any street or to close a direction of travel to facilitate their work without authorization from the Director of the Department of Public Works or the Highway Superintendent. The Chief of Police can also authorize a closure for a police or fire emergency. Construction zone traffic safety issues are to be addressed by using appropriate traffic control signs and devices and the use of police officers for traffic control to safely guide traffic through the work zone. If a closure is authorized by the DPW, it shall not be implemented until signs and police officers (where needed)

are properly in place in conformity with the written plan prepared by the contractor's engineer and approved by the DPW and Police Department."

Mayor Sullivan stated we did look at building a new high school. The MSBA said they would not give us any funds towards it. This will free up 22 classrooms town-wide. It will enhance our entire system. Then we can do more improvements at South.

The Town acknowledges that the MSBA's grant program is a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need, as determined by the MSBA, and any costs the Town incurs in excess of any grant approved by and received from the MSBA shall be the sole responsibility of the Town, and that the amount authorized pursuant to this vote shall be reduced by any grant amount set forth in the Feasibility Study Agreement that may be executed between the Town and the MSBA.

RE: Line Item Transfers to Fund Library and BPMA Collective Bargaining Agreements, fund COLA increases for non-BPMA employees and set aside funds for the remaining contracts

I am pleased to report that collective bargaining agreements have been reached between the Town of Braintree and the following unions Braintree Library Association workers and BPMA union. The agreement with the Library includes a two percent (2%) wage increase for the current fiscal year, two and a half percent (2 1/2%) in year two and two and a half percent (2 1/2%) in year three. The BPMA agreement includes a two percent (2%) wage increase for the current fiscal year, two and a half percent (2 1/2%) in year two and two and a half percent (2 1/2%) in year three. The non-BPMA employees received a two percent (2%) wage increase effective 7/1/16. These are fair and affordable agreements and stay within the fiscal parameters that we requested. In anticipation of approval of these agreements, funds were appropriated to a salary reserve account and the 9c reserve account in the previously approved Fiscal Year 2017 budget.
